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Remembering Shyama Priya Dasi

No one will argue that Prabhupada's books are the foundation of IPM's preaching work. His books are the time bombs that will explode in the heart of the conditioned soul when they are ready.

We need spiritual soldiers to make these bombs/books available to hundreds of inmates thirsty for this knowledge. That is where IPM volunteers come in. They send Prabhupada's books to inmates, correspond with them one on one, answer their questions, encourage them in their daily devotional practices and help them understand the importance of sharing the treasure of Krsna consciousness with others. Many set up spiritual programs at their chapel and in this way help develop a small group of bhaktas. There are also many who are alone and whose only outside contact is with an IPM volunteer. For all inmates, corresponding with IPM volunteers is vital. Working from their homes, the service of these volunteers often goes unnoticed. Shyama Priya was such unnoticed IPM volunteer.

It's been almost a year now, that Shyama Priya Dasi, aka *Mama Shyama* passed away, on April 16, 2009. For those of you who haven't heard of her, she had been relentlessly serving ISKCON Prison Ministry for over 20 years. She touched the lives of hundreds of inmates around USA, urging them to take to the chanting of the holy name and helping them transform into devotees of the Lord. And she pushed to do her service through thick and thin, happiness and distress. Even a couple weeks before her cancer forced her to stop, and although very weak, I witnessed her searching all over her apartment for a particular book she wanted me to send to an inmate.

I myself feel particularly indebted to Shyama Priya. Although I had corresponded for years with inmates, it is only through her association that I realized that I could sink much more energy into IPM, that it was truly a service to which I could dedicate myself fully.

I am saddened that she left not long after that realization. However, I "inherited" her service, and I have been fully engaged since then. In that way, as I continue her service here, in Alachua, FL, not a day goes by when I don't think about her, and I often wish she was here to advise me. Many times a week I open inmates' letters with the letter opener she herself used, and I weigh the letters I send on the scale she had and am reminded of her. Mama Shyama is very present in my IPM office.

I also think about her each time I accomplish something new for IPM; I think of how tickled she must be, I think "That one is for you, Shyama!", and it warms my heart. She wanted the inmate newsletter to be revived and the website reestablished; it is now a reality.

The second reason I feel indebted to Shyama Priya is that she allowed me to assist her during her transition from this world. I had never been close to anyone dying before, and it was one of the greatest lessons of my life. I admired the steadiness of her consciousness. A few days before passing away, she asked me to give her beads and she slowly whispered the maha mantra. Later on, even without her beads in her hand, her fingers kept moving while she was mouthing the mantra. She taught me that her years of Krsna conscious practice do pay off when it was time for the final test. Her experience made this a reality for me and every day it continues to help me to remember what is truly important.

All IPM volunteers think about Shyama Priya often, as she was a great inspiration and was always available to chat and encourage everyone.

Inmates have not forgotten about her either, as you can read from the letter below. This is only one inmate, but his sentiments are representative of that of numerous inmates all over the US who often reread her letters for guidance and who regularly refer to her in their own letters.

"Dear Mother Bhakti-lata,

Please accept my humble obeisance. All glories to His Divine Grace A.C. Bhaktivedanta Swami Prabhupada.

Mother Shyama Priya Devi's love was unconditional for even up to her last breath, she encouraged us to make progress in devotional service. Although, she suffered from pancreatic cancer, she was steady in her devotional service. Her offerings of love have enabled many of us prisoners to release ourselves from the prison of material life. May we always share her love for Krsna with others, for this is the grace of giving the mercy of the Lord to those who are suffering in worldly life.

"A devotee is compassionate", said Mother Shyama Priya, "for the suffering of the souls in this world. Everyone has some type of suffering to endure. The material world is built that way. The suffering is built-in and there is no escaping it. Either war, disease, suffering brought on by others, the *weather, hurricanes, tornadoes, earthquakes; it is endless.*" These teachings concerning suffering were dated February 18, 2009, at a time Mother Shyama Priya Devi was soon to disappear from our vision but not our hearts, on April 16, 2009.

I honestly admit that I have all her old letters which I re-enjoy over and over again; I never got rid of them because I knew they would one day become the encouragement I would need when I no longer had a mother. In this way I am fully dependent on our mother Shyama Priya Devi to care for my soul.

Mother was an enduring soul; nothing could interfere with her service. O Mother Shyama Priya, getting your association for so many years has been a blessing, for you have placed your lotus feet in my heart; leave them there forever as an offering of love.

You taught me that the only way is the Holy Name of the Lord. So I have hidden these instructions in my heart, only releasing them to offer them to others as an offering of love that will give them the way, the only way back home, back to Godhead.

As your spiritual son I will freely share the instructions you gave me. What greater lesson is there than the example you have shown us through living for Krsna?

"Changing the world inside and out by reaching out to others."



This past month, I received an e-mail from Nama Cintamani Dasi, who lives in Durban, South Africa. Below, is an excerpt of her letter describing the prison program she is participating in:

"The librarian at the prison, Rajeev Sewnarain is a congregation member. So we have placed quite a bit of Srila Prabhupada's books in the library.

We are only allowed to distribute a few tablespoons of halava on Friday after the service.

I manage to include a piece of maha prasad every week.

On Diwali day in Karttika last year, we were allowed to do a full program for a duration of about 3 hours. The program consisted of Arati to a deity of Sri Damodara, Accompanied by an ecstatic kirtana (with harmonium, Mridanga, Kartalas). This was followed by a talk on the significance of Kartika and the glories of Lord Damodara. Then each of the 70 odd prisoners offered a ghee lamp to the deity of Sri Damodara.

We were amazed how devotionally the prisoners offered their lamps.

The highlight of the program for them it seemed was the vegetarian feast consisting of breyani, dahl, halava, and a variety of biscuits and sweets and regular Vedic sweets also.

One inmate very feelingly commented that it was about 13 years ago that he ate this kind of a feast. Anand Maharaja who has been doing this program for the last 2 years is presently in hospital having undergone a triple by pass operation. He had encouraged an inmate to paint on canvas our presiding Deities Sri Sri Radha Radhanath, Sriman Mahaprabhu, and all the personalities on an ISKCON altar plus he wrote the pranam mantras ETC. on a separate canvas. So, during the programs the prison room is transformed and a few other calendar pictures are also put up.

We are now preparing for our annual Ratha-Yatra festival so I may not be able to do much until after the first week in April.

Recently a 20 -25 year old inmate told me that during the kirtan, he remembered how as a child, while looking out of his father's car, on many occasions, he saw the sticker " I love Krishna." He wanted us to bring him those stickers. He said he wanted to stick them on his prison door and at strategic places in the prison. Then, in this way he would get a chance to preach to people who inquired about the stickers. If people showed an active interest, he would invite them to our weekly Friday Program.

Once again thank you for your kindness and mercy."

Holy Jail; Freedom Within Captivity


Candramauli Swami compiled a book called HOLY JAIL, documenting the history and activities of ISKCON Prison Ministry.

You know, when I started reading Prabhupada's books my skeptical mind led me to check what he wrote about scriptures, time frames (etc). I

would track down things at the library and have my daughter check on things. I never found one single erroneous fact. I no longer have a need to research what Prabhupada says. I began offering obeisances to him prior to chanting and asking him to please accept my food as an offering to Lord Krsna.
