## A DELUXE EDITION OF ANIMAL LIFE

The following conversation between His Divine Grace A. C. Bhaktivedanta Swami Prabhupada and a Life Member of the International Society for Krishna Consciousness took place in August 1976 on an early-morning walk in Hyderabad, India.

**Life Member:** What is your view on birth control by contraception?


**Srila Prabhupada:** That is the most sinful activity. Birth control should be done by restraining sex.

**LM:** That is one way.

**Srila Prabhupada:** That is the only way approved in the *shastra* [scriptures]. All other ways are sinful.

**LM:** But people are committing sinful activities like contraception and abortion. What will happen to them?

**Srila Prabhupada:** They will suffer. Those who are killing children in the womb will themselves be killed. They will enter into a mother's womb and be killed. They will be punished, tit for tat. But that they do not know. These rascals have no education about the laws of nature. They're acting very independently, but Krishna says in the *Bhagavadgita* [3.27], *ahankara-vimudhatma* 



*kartaham iti manyate:* Those who think they can act independently of nature are *vimudhas*, rascals. They will be punished by the laws of nature, just like a thief who defies the laws of the government.

**LM:** What is the qualification of someone fit to have children?

Srila Prabhupada: The husband and wife should not have a child unless they can take full responsibility for saving him from the repetition of birth and death. That is the shastric injunction. In the material world everyone is rotating in the cycle of birth and death, transmigrating from one body to another ( tatha dehantara-praptih). And after many millions of years, one gets the chance to become a human being. Now, in this life, one can stop birth and death. That is Vedic culture—learning how to conquer the process of repeated birth and death (punar-janma-jaya). But that is possible only in human life. So the parents' duty is to train their children in such a way that their present birth is their last. And that training is Krishna consciousness.

Unfortunately, people are ignorant of this science. So both parents and children are staying in the cycle of birth and death and wasting the opportunity of having a human body. This is modern civilization. People do not know this science; they are kept in darkness. Their so-called education is useless, because they do not learn what the destination of life is.

Practically speaking, there is no education. The modern so-called education teaches you how to eat nicely, how to sleep nicely, how to have sex nicely, and how to defend nicely. And that is the business of the animals. They know how to eat, how to sleep, how to have sex, and how to defend. So the extra intelligence of the human being is making a deluxe edition of eating, sleeping, sex, and defense. The modern civilization is a deluxe edition of animal life. That's all.

**LM:** But many people would insist that the material progress of present-day society makes life worthwhile.

**Srila Prabhupada:** What will you do with your material progress at the time of death? Suppose you have a big bank balance, a nice house, good friends. At any moment death can come and kick you out. What can you do? As death, Krishna will come one day and take everything you have. Finished. And He may make you a dog. Now bark. How can you stop it? You have practiced how to bark in the legislative assembly. Now become a dog and go on barking-yow, yow, yow! This is going on.

No one knows the purpose of life. As Krishna says in the *Bhagavad-gita* [16.8], *asatyam apratishtham te jagad ahur anishvaram*. People are claiming this world is false

(asatyam), there is no cause (apratishtham), there is no God (anishvaram). So the modern civilization denies God, yet it is still trying to mitigate the miseries of life. But Bhagavad-gita proposes that first of all you should try to understand what your real misery is. Do you know what the real misery of your life is? What is the misery of your life?

**LM:** The misery of life is to live without divine knowledge.

**Srila Prabhupada:** Yes. The real misery of life is that although you are an eternal soul, with no birth or death, you are suffering repeated birth and death of the body. Therefore birth and death are your real miseries. This is knowledge.

But people have no brain to understand these things. Krishna clearly says, *na jayate mriyate va* [Bg. 2.20]: "For the soul there is neither birth nor death." But the rascals never think, "Why am I suffering birth? Why am I dying?" Where is their education? They are struggling to get free of misery, but they don't know what their actual misery is. They foolishly engage in the struggle for existence and hope for the survival of the fittest.

**LM:** The theory of the survival of the fittest may be applicable in our case because *fit* means?

**Srila Prabhupada:** *Fit* means "not getting another material body." That is being fit, because as soon as you get another material body you must suffer. People are mad, working day and night, but they are acting adversely to their own interest. You already have a body that is causing you suffering, and by your karma, your fruitive work, you are creating another body. And as soon as you get another material body, you'll have to suffer, whether you become a king or a dog.

People have no brain to solve this problem, although there is a solution. *Tyaktva deham punar janma naiti mam eti* [Bg. 4.9]: Krishna says in *Bhagavad-gita* that if you understand Him in truth, you can get out of the cycle of birth and death and go back to Godhead—no more birth and death.

So you have become our Life Member. Try to broadcast the philosophy of *Bhagavad-gita*. That is the meaning of membership. Everything is there in *Bhagavad-gita*. Thoroughly study *Bhagavad-gita* As It Is. Understand the philosophy of Krishna consciousness, apply it in your own life, and try to spread it among your friends.

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# **HOW I CAME TO KRŞŅA CONSCIOUSNESS**

## I AM CURRENTLY AWAITING TRIAL FOR A CAPITAL DEATH PENALTY CASE

llow me to share with you how I came to become a bhakta. I am sitting in a cell, awaiting trial for a capital death penalty case. And in all honesty, I may very well spend the rest of my life on Death Row. But that does not hold the anxiety for me that it once did. Allow me to share with you what changed in my thinking.



In 2006, a friend of mine in the Arizona State Prison System sent me a Prisoner's Resource List, and as I looked it over I saw an address for ISKCON Prison Ministry [IPM]. For some reason I was attracted to it, but I did not know why. As I look back, I can tell you that Kṛṣṇa attracted me, as He is all-attractive!

The first thing I learned was that I was not this body, but that I was a spirit soul (Bhagavad Gita 2.13). I was like, "Whoa! This is some far out stuff, man!" But the more I thought about it, it started to make sense. Kṛṣṇa was dissipating this illusion that was darkening my eyes. I came to the conclusion eventually that if once I am done with this body, I would move on to another

one. What is the point of allowing myself to become so distressed over facing what I was facing? So my first lesson was that I am not this body. What a revelation!

I flipped through the Gita, reading things that caught my interest. This verse jumped out at me like a flashing star: "Abandon all varieties of religion and just surrender unto Me. I shall deliver you from all sinful reactions. Do not fear." Wow! "Do not fear." Kṛṣṇa tells me that He would deliver me from all of my sinful reactions. But He also told me that I should surrender



unto Him. And as we all know, surrendering ourselves to anyone is not the easiest of things to do. It was a fearful thing to do – surrender all of my convict pride, and bow down to God. But He knows that it is hard. He said, "ma sucah". Do not fear or worry. And that is what I was doing, fearful of letting someone else run my life. But hey, where is the need for the fear, I wasn't running it well at all! I ran it into the ground. Kṛṣṇa knew that, so He said, "ma sucah"! Where is the fear?

I am now chanting 15 rounds of the maha mantra, and will be bumping it up one more very shortly. Where's the fear? I surrendered it to Kṛṣṇa. Why? Because the Supreme Personality of Godhead told me, "ma sucah"! I am no longer at the helm of my life. Lord Kṛṣṇa is running it. I won't lie to you and say it is all gravy, no; maya tries to trip me up from time to time. I am relying upon Lord Kṛṣṇa to give me the strength. And you know what? He is giving it to me. And I use it to do devotional service. Why? Because I love Him! I came across a beautiful prayer that Lord Caitanya prayed.



Allow me to share it and it will touch your heart! "I know no One but Kṛṣṇa as my Lord, and He shall remain so even if He handles me roughly by His embrace, or makes me broken-hearted by not being present before me. He is completely free to do anything and everything, for He is always my worshipful Lord, unconditionally." (Sri Siksastaka, verse 8)

Man! Doesn't that prick your heart? I want to be able to lay claim to this prayer some day! Unconditionally!!! Can you feel the love there? No matter how I live or die, I want to be able to glorify Kṛṣṇa through all the happiness and joy and through all the aches and pains. All I want to do is serve Krsna no matter what! Hare Krsna Hare Krsna Kṛṣṇa Kṛṣṇa Hare Hare Rama Hare Rama Rama Rama Hare Hare. As you read these 16 words with me, I thank you for the kirtan! I thank you for taking the time to read this. It is all true! After all, Kṛṣṇa is Truth! We are part and parcel of Him. I ask you not to just take it lightly, this ISKCON, also known as the Kṛṣṇa Consciousness Movement, is Lord Kṛṣṇa reaching out to you. Won't you come home with me? Come on, let's go back home to Godhead. Ma sucah.

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#### HOW RIVER THE YAMUNA CLEANED HERSELF IN 60 DAYS OF CORONAVIRUS LOCKDOWN

wo months of the Coronavirus lockdown have done what successive governments could not do in 25 years with over ₹ 5,000 crore at their disposal-clean up the Yamuna river.

As industrial activity halted and other commercial activities slowed during the lockdown, the Yamuna river cleaned herself, allowing numerous Indian and migratory birds to flock to her waters. One can now see Indian and migratory birds, such as Grey Heron, Ibis and Storks feasting on fish, which too can be seen swimming in the river's clearer waters.



"I have been associated with the Yamuna Action Plan since the year 2000 and I have never seen the river this clean. The level of pollution reduces further and her water becomes clearer near Etawah; here the water from the Chambal river further dilutes the pollution. I am amazed at the effect the lockdown has had on all rivers," said Dr Rajeev Chauhan, a conservation officer with the Wildlife Institute of India-Dehradun, who has been studying the Yamuna river for the past 30 years.

Almost 1,400 km in length, the Yamuna flows through seven states where industrial units discharge their effluents, mostly untreated, into it. Between Haryana's Panipat and Delhi alone, over 300 units of industrial discharge is released into the Yamuna, making her the country's most polluted river. The river picks up 80 per cent of its pollutants at Delhi, Agra and Mathura.

A finding by the Delhi Pollution Control Committee shows that in Delhi, compared to the pre-lockdown days, the river is now cleaner by around 33%. Additionally, the committee found that the water improved further downstream near Mathura.

"The river has cleaned herself using her own biological capacity. Now, state governments need to ensure that industrial waste is not dumped into it again," said Diwan Singh, an environmental conservationist who has been working for the revival of water bodies in Delhi, especially the Yamuna river.

Days after the country went into lockdown, unexpected visuals of cleaner rivers, blue skies and snow-capped peaks of Himalayas seen from various points became viral on the internet, highlighting the detrimental effect of human activity

on the environment. 🕉
