EXPANSIONS OF ILLUSION

The following conversation between His Divine Grace A.C. Bhaktivedanta Swami Prabhupada and some of his disciples took place in June 1974 during an early-morning walk in Paris.


Srila Prabhupada: What do you understand the word *maya* to mean?

Disciple: Placing value on something without seeing its relation to Krishna.

Srila Prabhupada: Yes. *Maya* is explained very nicely in the *Srimad-Bhagavatam* [2.9.34]:

rite 'rtham yat pratiyeta na pratiyeta chatmani tad vidyad atmano mayam yathabhaso yatha tamah

Seeing something to be disconnected from Krishna is *maya*, or illusion, because we are forgetting the original reality while taking the reflection to be very important. For example, suppose the sun is reflected in the water and then shines on the wall. If we take the light on the wall to be very important and forget the sun, the original reality, that is *maya*.



[Srila Prabhupada points to some nearby buildings.] These buildings were constructed without any thought of Krishna, but people regarded them with great enthusiasm. Now all that remains are relics. So, the energy expended

for manufacturing these buildings is *maya*, and the enthusiasm people now have for visiting these relics—that is also *maya*. All these things are expansions of *maya*, illusion.

Disciple: Parisians might complain that you don't appreciate the architectural skill involved?

Srila Prabhupada: No, we appreciate very much the intelligence of the architect, but if you forget Krishna while constructing a big building, then it is *maya*. Otherwise, it is reality. If the people of Paris would have installed the deity of Krishna in these buildings, how nice that would have been! People chanting, dancing, and taking *prasadam* every day. Then there would have been no *maya*. These big buildings should have been places for people to worship Krishna, but instead they're worshiping bones, some dead bones.

Disciple: People must be taught that everything belongs to Krishna.

Srila Prabhupada: It is a fact that everything belongs to Krishna. Why do they not understand?



Disciple: When we say, "Everything belongs to Krishna," they say, "We don't know Krishna."

Srila Prabhupada: That is nonsense. You may not know that everything belongs to Krishna, but you know that it belongs to somebody besides you. He may be called Krishna or something else—that doesn't matter—but nothing belongs to you. How can you deny it? Suppose I come here to Paris and stay for one week. Does that mean Paris is mine? Similarly, you come from the womb of your mother and stay in the world for, say, eighty years. Does that mean the world belongs to you?

So why are you claiming, "This is France," "This is Europe," "This is America," "This is my country"? Before your birth the land was here, and when you go it will remain here. So how can you claim that it is yours? What is the answer?

Disciple: The land belongs to the person who created it.

Srila Prabhupada: And who created it?

Disciple: Nature.

Srila Prabhupada: What is that nature? **Disciple:** The life force working behind?

Srila Prabhupada: Nature is Krishna's energy (mayadhyakshena prakritih suyate sacaracaram [Bhagavad-gita 9.10]). So everything is created by Krishna, and everything belongs to Krishna.

Disciple: Srila Prabhupada, the scriptures teach that we are actually tiny spirit souls—one ten-thousandth the tip of a hair—and yet we become so puffed up that we think, "I am God" or "I am the controller of the material nature." How is this illusion possible?

Srila Prabhupada: Because you are in the bodily concept of life. You do not know that you are a tiny spirit soul, a particle of consciousness. You are thinking, "I am this big fatty body," just as a dog is thinking, "I am a strong bulldog." It is the same illusion.

Disciple: But the materialist will insist that he is acting independently of God.

Srila Prabhupada: How is he independent of God? Napoleon wanted to finish his task, to conquer Europe, but he was kicked out of his position. Such a strong person, but he was not allowed to finish the task. How could he think that he was independent of God? That is foolishness. He was subject to being kicked out of his body at any moment, yet he was still thinking, "I am independent." Where was his independence? He was simply falsely puffed up. And now, after being kicked out, if he has taken the body of a cat or dog, what was the benefit of all his previous activities? In the *Bhagavadgita* [3.27] Krishna says, *prakriteh kriyamanani gunaih karmani sarvashah:* "Everything is going on under the stringent laws of nature." But we are such fools that we think we are independent.

Disciple: Srila Prabhupada, in *Bhagavad-gita* Krishna says that whatever we think of when we die will determine our next birth. So is it true that a materialist's accumulated mental impressions force him to take another body?

Srila Prabhupada: Yes.

Disciple: And a devotee doesn't accumulate any mental impressions?

Srila Prabhupada: No. He has mental impressions; his mental impressions are of Krishna. He's always thinking of Krishna. For example, we may have some propensity

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to create a beautiful place like this park. We have creative energies. Therefore it is advised, *nirbandhah krishna-sambandhe:* create for Krishna. In India people have also created big fortlike buildings, but they are temples for worshiping Krishna. If the people who built this park had spent their energy for creating it in relationship to Krishna, they would have been purified. But because this

park is simply meant for sense gratification, we know that the people who built it were under the laws of nature. So they increased their material contamination. You may create so many things, but if you become contaminated by the modes of material nature and have to accept the body of a cat or dog, then what is your benefit?


HOW I CAME TO KRŞŅA CONSCIOUSNESS

My Curiosity Developed A Life Of Its Own

It was late in 2016 at Mount Olive Correctional Complex, when I met Tirtha Dasa. Tirtha approached my cell door to introduce himself and to say that I looked familiar. I had only been housed at Mount Olive for approximately three years and Tirtha had seen me running track long distance on the yard; this was a particularly difficult time in my life and now that I ponder on the last few years I realize that I was blessed by this seemingly simple conversation with a stranger. Tirtha Dasa asked if I knew of Krishna Consciousness, I answered that I had heard of the name Krishna and that He was associated with Vedic culture, but beyond that my understanding was vague. Tirtha offered to let me borrow his copy of the Mahabharata and then told me about Bhagavad-Gītā. As I read Mahabharata I encountered a fascinating epic unlike any other I had ever read.

The next day Tirtha told me about chanting the Maha mantra and about the sin of eating meat and the general dangers of sense gratification. He encouraged me to write and learn more.



My initial interest went no further than simple questions and basic readings. As time passed my curiosity developed a life of its own. I wrote to ISKCON, received a devotee Pen Pal, began a correspondence course in Krishna Consciousness, received a copy of the Gītā, and, in time, all of Srīla Prabhupada's books. I have been incarcerated nearly eleven years and have been seriously studying Krishna Consciousness for slightly more than one year now. Although having lost everything I ever had and everyone I ever knew, I have found the greatest treasure imaginable, I have found Krishna, and I now know that I don't need anyone or anything else.

I am very grateful to Tirtha Dasa for approaching me that day and I am very grateful to everyone at ISKCON Prison Ministry who have served as the tools of Krishna to ensure that although I was born in the darkness of ignorance, my eyes might be opened by the torch of knowledge. My respectful obeisances are unto you all.

In The Darkness Kṛṣṇa Doth Shine

Coming into Kṛṣṇa Consciousness was very simple and easy for me. I was already a practicing Zen Buddhist Monk meditating on emptiness, and nothingness for years until one day Kṛṣṇa came and filled that emptiness into fullness with his divine and Supreme light. One day in 2015 I woke up on my rack only to see four guys attacking another guy for his cell phone. The only Mantra I knew at the Time was the Hare Kṛṣṇa Maha Mantra. So I was scared but started chanting anyway. I prayed to Kṛṣṇa That this guy would be alright. And well he did. A Kṛṣṇa Miracle happened that day. The victim walked up to the Bubble or officer's station and was helped by officers to Medical. He was hurt but okay. I believe to this day it was Kṛṣṇa who saved his very life.





By this time I had been a devotee for one year. I only had a Gita given to me by an older devotee. I was the only one on my whole compound doing prasadam, vegetarian eating, chanting, and watching Prabhupada's lectures. Soon others noticed and I answered questions but no one was too heavy on getting serious. My first darshan [seeing the Lord] came to me in a dream. I would chant the Maha Mantra Hare Krsna Hare Krsna Krsna Krsna Hare Hare Hare Rama Hare Rama Rama Rama Hare Hare for three hours from 7 to 10pm. And it was beautiful because Krsna appeared before me in a dream. I was meditating in a forest and Kṛṣṇa walked by and smiled. I wasn't scared but just a bit surprised. He walked in my dream state. So this was nice experience but I knew it wouldn't last, so I released any attachment [that it would happen again].

My transition into Kṛṣṇa Consciousness happened sometime in late 2014. It was the one pointed devotion of another devotee that actually drew me toward Kṛṣṇa mentally. Even now on CM [Control Management], I am able to meditate longer and chant more. Combining this with some yoga stretches in the morning is perfect! I can still remember the day when I asked my friend about Kṛṣṇa. Bhakti Yoga is truly a path of effulgent devotion. More people should try it, it liberates you. When will you begin this inner Journey of Awakening Kṛṣṇa Consciousness within mindfully? After all is said and done Kṛṣṇa Consciousness fills the void within.

North American Teams See Book Distribution Increase During COVID-19 Marathon

"When the lockdown started, nobody thought we could distribute books, and everybody was worried about what would happen," says Shyama Mohini Dasi, co-sankirtan leader at ISKCON Toronto, Canada. "But Vaisesika Prabhu encouraged us to think differently, and innovate."

Every year since 2007, devotees at Toronto, ISKCON Silicon Valley, and other temples – inspired by Global Duty Officer for book distribution Vaisesika Das – have held a Bhaktivinode Thakur Marathon for the six weeks between Nrsimha Chaturdasi and Bhaktivinode Thakur's appearance day.

This year, from May 6th to June 20th, ISV devotees actually doubled the number of books distributed, despite

being unable to physically approach people due to the pandemic lockdown.

With a poster and video from Vaisesika encouraging devotees to "distribute from home – all you need is a phone," teams across North America as well as in London, England also posted incredible numbers of Srila Prabhupada's books.

Team ISV distributed 13,861 books and 253 sets; Team Harinama Ashrama NYC 5,570 books and 136 sets; Team London, UK 1,235 books and 4 sets; Team Laguna Beach 1,000 books and 40 sets; and Team Toronto 875 books and 31 sets.

Teams in Seattle, Philadelphia, Houston, Delware, Chicago and Round Rock, Texas rounded out the effort for a total of 26,4747 books and 519 sets.

To take the edge off and make the sankirtan fun, devotee organized virtual "calling parties" on Zoom, which provided moral support and gave the feeling of distributing all together. Around 30 devotees at a time would call people from their own homes and distribute books over the phone, while simultaneously consulting each other for help on Zoom and reporting successes.

"We would start by calling contacts we had made before, on sankirtan or at temple festivals, dating back to 2014," says Malini Dasi, co-sankirtan leader at ISKCON Silicon Valley. "We would introduce ourselves, and make a connection. Then we would present the books. If they accepted them, we would ask for a donation, and tell them about contactless shipping — we either ship directly through USPS or deliver the books and leave them outside people's doors. We also offer e-books if they are not comfortable with paper books."

Devotees also reached out on social media such as WhatsApp, Facebook, and Instagram, messaging people they already had a connection with through mutual friends.

"A lot of people sent us pictures of themselves with the books they had received," Vaisesika says. "And those pictures actually inspired new people to buy books also."

In addition, Brajananda Das of the Krishna House in Tallahassee, Florida developed an innovation that saw devotees in Tallahassee, Toronto, and ISV sending out 'care packages' for donations. Depending on the temple, these included books, prasadam, beads, and/or gift coupons for the local Govinda's restaurant. In London, UK, meanwhile, devotees sent out free care packages to essential workers. Some of the recipients of such care packages were so delighted to receive them that they contacted devotees asking for more books, including full Srimad-Bhagavatam sets.

Among the thousands of books distributed during the lockdown marathon were 750 e-books and 53 e-book sets by ISV and Toronto, a historical achievement as it was the first time e-books had been distributed in a major way. E-books are in particular demand during the pandemic, and Vaisesika says that all efforts are being made to make e-books available in more languages so that they can be distributed globally.

E-books are also being bundled with other services such as a free month's subscription to the Bhakti Community Online (https://bhakti.community/), where recipients can access courses and podcasts that help them learn more about the timeless texts of Bhakti Yoga and how to implement devotional practices into their daily life.

The next innovation will be audiobooks, a \$3.5 billion market in the secular world. "Keshava Bharati Goswami, who is leading the charge, is dedicating upwards of six to eight hours a day to narrate all of Srila Prabhupada's books, and just recently finished the whole Sri Chaitanya Charitmarita," Vaisesika says. "We're hoping that some audiobooks will be available by the end of this year."

Meanwhile book distribution has not slowed down since the Bhaktivinode Thakur marathon ended on June 20th. The very next day, in fact, temples around North America and the world restarted the Bhadra Campaign, an effort to distribute at least 10,000 sets of Srimad-Bhagavatam that started on Gaura Purnima in March this year and will culminate on Bhadra Purnima on September 2nd.

The campaign will also serve to unite the world in book distribution, with teams from India, North America, Europe, Africa, and Australia all using remote strategies to distribute Srimad-Bhagavatam sets during the pandemic.

Among the devotees serving on the campaign are children, including one-and-a-half-year-old Kunjari, the daughter of ISV devotees. The precocious Kunjari, who heard the entire Srimad-Bhagavatam in the womb before she was even born, stars in an impossibly cute video presenting the sacred text that has gone viral and inspired many to purchase the Bhagavatam.

"One devotee was trying to distribute a Bhagavatam set, but the person they were talking to was hesitant and said no," Malini recalls. "After the devotee shared Kunjari's video with them, however, they immediately responded back saying that they wanted the full set."

Devotees' efforts at contactless book distribution, through all these methods, have been transforming lives during a very difficult time for humanity.

"The books have changed the trajectory of my life under quarantine and shall for here after," wrote gym teacher and author Jeff Winkowski from Milwaukee, Wisconsin. "What is fascinating is that my study of Srimad Bhagavatam and all of Prabhupada's writings have helped me become a better father, a better friend, and a better son. I am so thankful for NYC Harinam and the association of the devotees whom Krishna has brought into my life after these auspicious books entered my home."

Another recipient, Morgan Heche, wrote, "I am really grateful that I was offered the opportunity to get some of Srila Prabhupada's books delivered to my home. While we have been experiencing so many changes over the last few months, including the temple being closed, it has been so important to have this wisdom to turn to while navigating our day to day lives. Care and attention was given for keeping things clean and safe during the delivery. Thank you for this compassionate service!"

"We felt triumphant when we presented our scores to Srila Prabhupada and Bhaktivinode Thakur last weekend," Vaisesika says. "Because it was a sweet victory to be faced with amid such uncertainty. We are continuing to depend on Lord Chaitanya and the mercy of the Acharyas, and are again moving forward with confidence that we're not doing this – they are."


