HOW TO FIND PERFECT KNOWLEDGE IN AN IMPERFECT WORLD

This conversation between His Divine Grace A.C. Bhaktivedanta Swami Prabhupada and physicist Gregory Benford took place in October 1973, at the Los Angeles Hare Krsna center.


Dr. Benford: You are probably familiar with what Western theology calls "the problem of evil": Why does evil exist?

Srila Prabhupada: Evil is the absence of good, just as darkness is the absence of sunlight. If you keep yourself always in the light, where is the question of darkness? God is all-good. So if you keep yourself always in God consciousness, then there is no evil.

Dr. Benford: But why was the world created with evil men?

Srila Prabhupada: Why was the police department created? Because there is a necessity. Similarly, some living entities want to enjoy this material world; therefore God creates it. He is just like a father who gives a separate room to his mischievous children to play in. Otherwise, the naughty boys would always disturb him.

Dr. Benford: This world, then, is something like a prison?



Srila Prabhupada: Yes, it is a prison. Therefore, there is suffering here. In the prison house you cannot expect comfort, because unless there is suffering, there is no

lesson for the prisoners. That is stated in the *Bhagavad-gita; duhkhalayam asasvatam. Duhkhalayam* means "the place for suffering." And *asasvatam* means "temporary." You cannot make a compromise and say,

"All right, I am suffering, but I don't care about that—I shall remain here." You cannot remain here; you will be kicked out. Now you are thinking that you are an American, you are a great scientist, you are happy, you are getting a good salary.... That's all right, but you cannot stay in this post. The day will come when you will be kicked out. And you do not know whether you are going to be an American or a scientist or a cat or dog or demigod. You do not know.

Dr. Benford: I think that I will probably be nothing.

Srila Prabhupada: No, that is another kind of ignorance. Krsna explains in the *Bhagavad-gita*


[2.12], *dehino 'smin yatha dehe kaumaram yauvanam jara / tatha dehantara-praptih*: first you are in the body of a boy, then a young man, and in the future you will be in the body of an old man—

Dr. Benford: But after I'm an old man I might be nothing.

Srila Prabhupada: No, no. *Tatha dehantara-praptih*: after death you will pass into another body. So. you cannot say, "I am going to be nothing." Of course, you may say anything, , but the laws are different. You may know the law, or you may not know the law.' It doesn't matter—the law will act. For example, if you think, "I will touch the fire—it will not burn me," that is not a fact. It will burn. Similarly, you may think there is nothing after death, but it is not a fact.

Dr. Benford: Why does a person like me—someone who's trying to understand the world rationally—seem to find no way in which to do it?

Srila Prabhupada: You are trying to know things rationally, but you are not going to the proper teacher.Dr. Benford: But I feel that by studying the world I can acquire knowledge, and there is a way to check that



knowledge. You formulate hypotheses, you perform experiments, you verify your ideas, and then you see if you can use these ideas in the practical world. **Srila Prabhupada:** That is one more kind of

> ignorance—because you do not know that you are imperfect. **Dr. Benford:** Oh, I know that I'm not perfect.

Srila Prabhupada: Then what is the use of your trying to study the world this way and that way? If you are imperfect, the result will be imperfect.

Dr. Benford: That's true. **Srila Prabhupada:** So why waste your time?

Dr. Benford: But there doesn't seem to be any other way of finding knowledge.

Srila Prabhupada: Even for material knowledge, you have to go to the university and consult a professor. Similarly, when you want to learn spiritual

knowledge—perfect knowledge—you have to approach a perfect teacher. Then you will get perfect knowledge. **Dr. Benford:** But how does one know when the teacher is perfect?

Srila Prabhupada: It is not difficult. A perfect teacher

is one who has learned from another perfect teacher. **Dr. Benford:** But that merely removes the problem a step. **Srila Prabhupada:** No, because there is one perfect teacher— Krsna—who is accepted by all classes of teachers. In India we still find the Vedic culture, which is taught by Vedic scholars. And all these Vedic teachers accept Krsna as the supreme teacher. They take lessons from Krsna and teach that.

Dr. Benford: So anyone I meet who accepts Krsna as the perfect teacher—he is a perfect teacher? **Srila Prabhupada:** Yes. Anyone who is teaching the teachings of Krsna—he is a perfect teacher. **Dr. Benford:** Then all the

devotees here are perfect teachers? Srila Prabhupada: Yes, because they are teaching only Krsna's teachings, that's all. They may not be perfect. But whatever they are speaking is perfect, because it is taught by Krsna.

Dr. Benford: Then you are not perfect? **Srila Prabhupada:** No, I am not perfect. None of us claim that we are perfect—we have so many defects. But because we don't speak anything beyond Krsna's teachings, our teaching is perfect. We are just like a postman who brings you a money order for one thousand dollars. He is not a rich man, but if he delivers to you the envelope as it is, you are benefited. He is not a rich man, but his perfect dealing—his honest dealing—is perfect. Similarly, we are not perfect; we are full of imperfections. But we don't go beyond the teachings of Krsna—that is our process—and therefore our teachings are perfect.

Before I started to write to ISKCON or knew what it were, I was professing the religion of



STORIES FROM THE ŚRĪMAD-BHĀGAVATAM

THE STORY OF LORD VĀMANA —from Canto 8, chapters 18 & 19

Vedic history tells of an incident many hundreds of thousands of years ago, during a period of conflict between the demigods and the demons, when the demons came to power, sending the legitimate ruling demigods into hiding.

The king of the demons at that time was Bali Mahārāja, who was the grandson of Mahārāja Prahlada, a great devotee, and whose greatgrand-father was Hiranyakasipu, a very powerful demon. His spiritual master was Sukaracharya, a

hereditary brāhmaņa (born of a brahman (priest) father, but without brahmana qualifications himself).

Harassed by the demons, the demigods prayed to Lord Vishnu, the maintainer of the universe, to help them regain their rightful properties and administrative posts. In answer to their prayers, the Lord then appeared as the extraordinarily beautiful dwarf brahmana child Vāmanadeva , who was the Personality of Godhead Himself.

Wearing a belt of straw, a sacred thread, an upper garment of deerskin, and matted locks of hair,



Lord Vāmanadeva entered Bali Maharaja's arena of sacrifice. His shining effulgence diminished the brilliance of all the priests and their disciples, who thus stood from their seats and welcomed the Lord properly by offering obeisances.

> Bali Mahārāja, jubilant at seeing Lord Vāmanadeva, offered Him a seat with great satisfaction, and worshiped Him by washing His lotus feet and placing the water on his head. He told Vāmanadeva: "O son of a brāhmana, it appears that You have come here to ask me for something. Therefore, whatever You want You may take from me. O best of those who are worshipable, You may take from me a cow, gold, a furnished house, palatable food and drink, the daughter of a brahmana for Your wife, prosperous villages, horses, elephants, chariots or whatever You desire." Bali Mahārāja, was very charitably disposed. Sometimes the atheists are also very charitable; they do pious activities,

give charity and welfare work, but also think, 'why should we bother about God?' Such persons, even though very moral and pious in the estimation of the material world, are also demons, on account of their apathy for Krishna Consciousness.

Vāmanadeva replied, "O King, who are able to give charity munificently, I ask of you only three paces of land, to the measurement of My steps. Although you are able to give Me as much land as I want, I do not want anything from you that is unnecessary."

Bali was surprised at this request for so little land and he replied, "I am able to give You an entire island because I am the proprietor of the three divisions of the universe. You have come to take something from me and have pleased me by Your sweet words, but You are asking only three paces of land. Therefore You are not very intelligent. O small boy, one who approaches me to beg something should not have to ask anything anymore, from anywhere. Therefore, if You wish,

You may ask from me as much land as will suffice to maintain You according to Your needs."

Vāmanadeva, the Personality of Godhead said: "O my dear King, even the entirety of whatever there may be within the three worlds cannot satisfy a person whose senses are uncontrolled. One should be satisfied with whatever he achieves by his previous destiny, for discontent can never bring happiness. A person who is not self-controlled will not be happy even with possessing the three worlds. Material existence causes discontent in regard to fulfilling one's lusty desires and achieving more and more money. This is the cause for the continuation of material life, which is full of repeated birth and death. But one who is satisfied by that which is obtained by destiny is fit for liberation from this material existence. A brahmana who is satisfied with whatever is providentially obtained is increasingly enlightened with spiritual power, but the spiritual potency of a dissatisfied brahmana decreases, as fire diminishes in potency when water is sprinkled upon it. Therefore, O King, from you, the best of those who give charity, I ask only three paces of land. By such a gift I shall be very pleased, for the way of happiness is to be fully satisfied to receive that which is absolutely needed."

After Vāmanadeva had thus spoken to Bali Mahārāja, Bali smiled and told Him, "All right. Take whatever You like."

Śukrācārya, his spiritual master, then immediately spoke as follows to his disciple, "This brahmacārī



(student) in the form of a dwarf is directly the imperishable Supreme Personality of Godhead, Vishnu. You do not know what a dangerous position you have accepted by promising to give Him land. This person falsely appearing as a brahmacārī is actually the Supreme Personality of Godhead, Hari, who has come in this form to take away all your land, wealth, beauty, power, fame and education. After taking everything from you, He will deliver it to Indra, your enemy. You have promised to give Him three steps of land in charity, but

when you give it, He will occupy the three worlds. You are a rascal! You do not know what a great mistake you have made. After giving everything to Lord Vishnu, you will have no means of livelihood. How then shall you live?"

In reality, Śukrācārya was afraid for his own position; he was living at the cost of Bali Maharaja, so if Vāmanadeva took everything away from Bali Maharaja, how would he maintain himself? That is a material calculation. The materialist does not want to serve or to give to Vishnu, because he thinks that by giving away to Vishnu he will be put in a povertystricken condition. Actually that is not the fact. This is a materialistic estimation; a materialistic way of worshiping. Materialists are always careful to first maintain their material status quo first, and only second try to please Vishnu, although they profess to be devotees of Vishnu. Therefore the Krishna Consciousness persons are greater than such materialistic worshippers. Materialists perform all pious activities or devotional activities for some material gain, and as soon as there is any hindrance in the path of material gain, they at once become demons. Therefore "bhakti" means without any material desires. That is the sign of a pure devotee; he has no motive to satisfy his material desires by devotional service.

When Bali Mahārāja was thus advised by his spiritual master, Śukrācārya, he remained silent for some time, and then, after full deliberation, he replied to his spiritual master as follows, "I am the grandson of Mahārāja Prahlāda. How can I withdraw my promise because of greed for money, when I have already said that I shall give this land? How can I behave like an ordinary cheater, especially toward a brahmana? There is nothing more sinful than untruthfulness. Because of this, Mother Earth once said, "I can bear any heavy object, but I cannot bear a liar." O great sage, great saintly persons worship Lord Vishnu in all circumstances. Therefore, whether that same Lord Vishnu has come here to give me all benedictions or to punish me as an enemy, I must carry out His order and give Him the promised tract of land without hesitation.

Śukrācārya replied, "Although you have no knowledge, you have become a so-called learned person, and therefore you dare be so impudent as to disobey my order. Because of disobeying me, you shall very soon be bereft of all your opulence."

Even after being cursed in this way by his so-called spiritual master, Bali Mahārāja, being a great personality, never deviated from his determination. Therefore, according to custom, he first offered water to Vāmanadeva and then offered Him the gift of land he had promised.

were very angry and attacked the Lord and His devotees. However, after a short battle, Bali Mahārāja ordered his followers to desist.

Lord Vāmana then said, "O King of the demons, you have promised to give Me three steps of land, but I have occupied the entire universe with two steps. Now think about where I should put My third step."

Bali Mahārāja said: "O best Personality of Godhead, most worshipable for all the demigods, if You think that my promise has become false, I shall certainly rectify matters to make it truthful. I cannot allow my promise to be false. Please, therefore, place Your third lotus footstep on my head. Since Your Lordship is indirectly the greatest well-wisher of us demons, You act for our best welfare by posing as if our enemy. Because

> demons like us always aspire for a position of false prestige, by chastising us You give us the eyes by which to see the right path. My grandfather Prahlāda Mahārāja is famous, being recognized by all Your devotees. Although harassed in many ways by his father, the demon Hiranyakaśipu, he still remained faithful to You, taking shelter at Your lotus feet. What is the use of the material body, which automatically leaves its owner at the end of life? And what is the use of all one's family members, who are actually plunderers taking away money that is useful for the service of the Lord? What is the use of a wife? She is only the source of increasing material

conditions. And what is the use of family, home, country and community? Attachment for them merely wastes the valuable energy of one's lifetime. Only by providence have I been forcibly brought under Your lotus feet and deprived of all my opulence. Because of the illusion created by temporary opulence, people in general, who live under material conditions, facing accidental death at every moment, do not understand that this life is temporary. Only by providence have I been saved from that condition."

Material opulence is so bewildering that it makes even a learned, self-controlled man forget to search for the goal of self-realization.

While Bali Mahārāja was describing his fortunate position in this way, the most dear devotee of the Lord, Prahlāda Mahārāja, appeared there, like the moon rising in the nighttime. Being bound by the ropes of Varuna,

The unlimited Supreme Personality of Godhead, who had assumed the form of Vāmana, then began increasing in size, until everything in the universe was within His body, including the earth, the planetary systems, the sky, the directions, the seas, the oceans, the birds, beasts, human beings, the demigods and the great saintly persons. He covered the entire surface of the earth with one footstep, the sky with His body, and all directions with His arms. As He took His second step, He covered the heavenly planets. And not even a spot remained for the third step. He then bound Bali Mahārāja, with the ropes of Varuna.

The associates of the Lord present there jubilantly worshiped the Him, celebrating His victory. When the demoniac followers of Mahārāja Bali saw that their master had lost all his possessions to Vamanadeva, they



Bali Mahārāja could not offer befitting respect to Prahlāda Mahārāja as he had before. Rather, he simply

offered respectful obeisances with his head, his eyes being inundated with tears and his face lowered in shame. When the great personality Prahlāda Mahārāja saw that the Supreme Lord was sitting there, surrounded and worshiped by His intimate associates, he was overwhelmed with tears of jubilation. Approaching the Lord and falling to the ground, he offered obeisances to the Lord with his head.

Prahlad Mahārāja said, "Prahlāda Mahārāja said: My Lord, it is Your Lordship who gave this Bali the very great opulence of the post of heavenly king, and now, today, it is You who

have taken it all away. I think You have acted with equal beauty in both ways. Because his exalted position as King of heaven was putting him in the darkness of ignorance, You have done him a very merciful favor by taking away all his opulence. Material opulence is so

bewildering that it makes even a learned, self-controlled man forget to search for the goal of self-realization."

> In the end, the Lord transferred Bali Mahārāja from the heavenly planet to the planet Sutala, which is hundreds of times better than heaven. When the Supreme Personality of Godhead deprives His devotee of material opulences, this does not mean that the Lord puts him into poverty; rather, the Lord ultimately promotes him to a higher position. The Supreme Personality of Godhead did not even ask Bali Mahārāja to separate from his family; instead, the Lord allowed him to stay with his family members and also assured him of all protection from the effects of bad association with the

demons. Bali Mahārāja certainly became an exalted devotee and the Supreme Personality of Godhead assured him that his demoniac mentality would be annihilated. In other words, by the association of devotees, the demoniac mentality is vanquished.

HOW I CAME TO KŖṢŅA CONSCIOUSNESS

SCARED TO BECOME A DEVOTEE — By Jatayu Dasa

long, long time ago, when I was not an ISKCON devotee, I developed a growing interest in spiritual life. After many years of taking drugs and attending rock concerts I had become sick of life.

I had been a manager in several companies I worked for; most of the time I had more money than I needed and I had freedom and independence. However, somehow, I was not satisfied. I started wondering if real



happiness existed. I discovered that no matter how hard I tried, I just could not break free from certain unhealthy activities. I was looking for real freedom; freedom from the unseen forces that drove me to seek out all

those things people said would make me happy but in truth bound me with chains. I was confused. Where do I turn now? Then one day I had the courage to admit to myself that, with all these desirable things, I was not happy. This was the first scary thing; to admit I was not happy.

My life then began to change. Again, I became scared because I didn't really know where I was going. All I knew was I didn't want to be where I was. I was haunted by a thousand fears; what should I do now; will I have money? Will I have friends? Will I be cared for? And on and on. So I started to read. First it was science, then psychology, and then self-help. It didn't fit. I was scared again, where do I go?

So I tried Eastern philosophy. Now, here was something. I read more and learned a lot. I learned drugs were bad, so I stopped. As a result I lost 85% of my friends, and then I got really scared; but excited at the same time. If they were really my friends then they would support me to improve my life. So I took another step. I learned that happiness was not found in women, TV, eating dead animals, or in reading numerous books. I gave it all up, even though I was scared.

Then I learned happiness was not found in Rock and Roll. This is going too far I thought, so I held on. But in

the meantime my life had changed direction a dozen times and I had to admit that I was finding a wonderful sense of freedom from all the things that I thought gave me happiness. I was not doing many of these things and I was still alive. And in many ways becoming happy. But still I knew I had to go further. There was something deep inside that wasn't being fulfilled. I began to practice Hatha Yoga. Amazing things happened. I became strong both mentally and physically. I was more alert, I felt alive. But, deep inside a voice cried out for more.

Then I met the devotees. Now I was scared again. I had seen them before but did not take them seriously. Although I was now attracted to them, I turned away. But I saw them again, and again I was scared, but of what? I was afraid to lose my independence. But what was so great about my so-called independence? I made all my own decisions, I was my own man, but I was also unhappy.

I wanted to break away completely from the material world. I wanted God in my life. I want to try it, I thought. But what if I failed? What will I have to give up? I was really scared now. I will have to give up Rock and Roll and I will have to follow rules and regulations. But deep down inside, my heart said, 'try it.'

Scared as I was, I took a few steps. And wow; it worked. Kind of. I didn't become a saint and I didn't see the white light, but I



did begin to feel inner peace. I took another step and fell down. And it hurt.

I took another step and fell down. What now? I tried again and started to walk. I began to realize that Krsna was everywhere, even in my own life. I began to understand that Krsna was a Person and that I had a relationship with Him, a loving relationship that was eternal. I was actually becoming happy. Sometimes even tears of joy came to my eyes. I even gave up Rock and Roll, and I survived.

Today, I'm still scared but I keep taking those next steps. I still fall down, and I still get back up. I'm succeeding in spiritual life. But I did not do it alone. I always found the greatest source of strength from my

devotee friends. Of course, I had to reach out to them; they could not read my mind. I had to ask for help. This too I had to learn. I had to ask the right questions and when I got the answers I acted on that knowledge.

Over the years I matured, my vision to continue comes from reading Srila Prabhupada's books, my encouragement comes from seeing devotees around me work hard and succeed, and my goal remains clear by humbly serving Krsna the best way I can. Being scared is natural for all

living entities when they are put into uncertain circumstances.

But when we come to realize that Krsna is our best friend and that His love for us is eternal, then there is nothing in this world that is fearful. He loves us, not



like our limited love for each other, but real love; a kind of love that has no comparison in our life. And when this love touches us we will not be scared to take the next step. I am scared of death, but Krsna will defeat that for me, simply by the sound of His name. And when I wake up in the spiritual world, there will be no more pain, nor suffering, nor fear, just eternity,

knowledge and bliss, like the scriptures have told me all along.

I thought that life in the material world was bad; actually it is life in material consciousness that is bad. All of us go through these changes to some degree or other. We have learned that Krsna consciousness is a collective process as well as an individual process. We can see that Krsna consciousness is not otherworldly or abstract, but is very down to earth, natural and real. Our lives in the material world will go on, raising children, working a job, caring for friends. But when we add Krsna

to our lives then life finally has a real purpose. Life becomes meaningful and we can become happy. We just have to be willing to take the next step.

What is a Vyasa-Puja Celebration?

This year, on August 27, is the day when Śrīla Prabhupāda appeared on this earth.

Every year, his disciples celebrate his appearance day with fasting (till noon), reading offerings devotees wrote, kīrtana, and honoring a prasadam feast cooked in his honor. Why do we do that? As Prabhupāda himself explains:

"Actually there is no difference between hearing directly from Krishna and hearing directly from Krishna via a bona fide spiritual master like Vyasa. 
