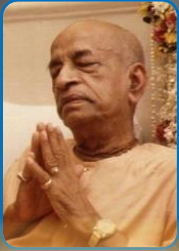

PRABHUPADA SPEAKS OUT — The End of Kali-Yuga: no more Hare Kṛṣṇa

This conversation between Srila Prabhupada and the poet and writer, Allen Ginsberg—who embodied various aspects of the counterculture—took place on May 13, 1969, in Columbus, Ohio.

Srila Prabhupada: Lord Buddha is accepted as an incarnation of Kṛṣṇa. This is stated in the *Bhagavatam*. He is accepted as the ninth incarnation. Baladeva is the eighth. And the tenth is awaiting.

Allen Ginsberg: Kalki.

Srila Prabhupada: Kalki.

Allen Ginsberg: Now, what is Kalki's nature?

Srila Prabhupada: That is described in the *Bhagavatam*. He will come just like a prince, with royal dress and sword, on horseback simply killing, no preaching. There will be no brain to understand God.

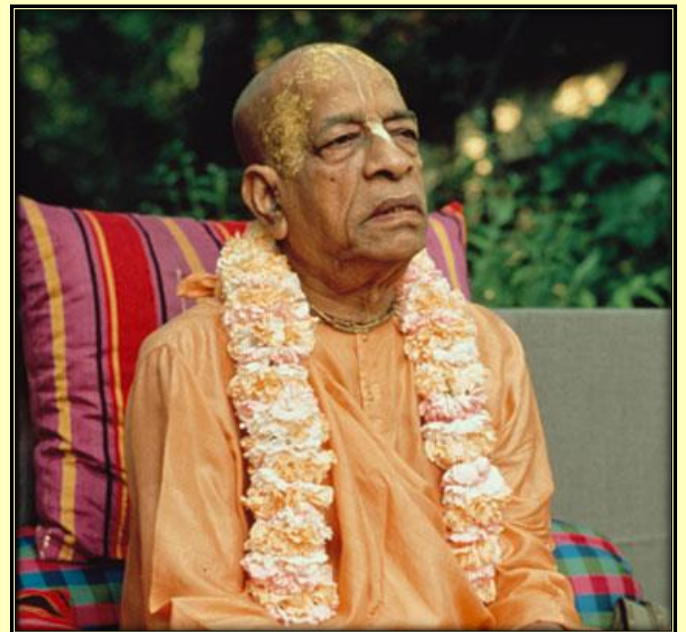
Allen Ginsberg: There will be no brain to understand God?

Srila Prabhupada: People will be so dull. It requires a brain to understand...

Allen Ginsberg: So Kalki comes at the end of the Kali-yuga?

Srila Prabhupada: Yes. Then Satya-yuga will begin.

Allen Ginsberg: Which is?



Srila Prabhupada: Satya-yuga is the pious age. People will be pious, truthful, long-living.

Allen Ginsberg: Are those the people that will remain, or are they from whatever new creation comes out of the destruction?

Srila Prabhupada: All the miscreants will be killed. And there must be some pious. They remain.

Allen Ginsberg: Do you think of this in terms of a historical event that will occur in the lifetime of your disciples?

Srila Prabhupada: No. This will happen at least 400,000 years from now. So at that time my disciples will be with Krsna. [Laughter.]

Devotees: Haribol!

Srila Prabhupada: And those who will not follow them, they will see the fun how they are being killed. [Laughter.]

Allen Ginsberg: Will people still be chanting Hare Krsna in 400,000 years?

Srila Prabhupada: No. Hare Krsna will be finished within ten thousand years. There will be no more Hare Krsna.

Allen Ginsberg: Ah. So what will be left?

Srila Prabhupada: Nothing. I'll kill you and eat you, and you shall kill me. You shall eat me. That will be left.

Allen Ginsberg: After ten thousand years?

Srila Prabhupada: Yes, there will be no grain, no milk, no sugar, no fruit. So I will have to eat you, and you will have to eat me. Full facility for meat-eating. [Laughter.] Full facility. Krsna is very kind. He'll give you facility: "All right. Why cows and calves? You take your own son. Yes. Eat nicely." Just like serpents, snakes they eat their own offspring. Also tigers. So this will happen. And there will be no brain to understand [God], no preachers, nothing. And then Krsna will come: "All right, let Me kill you so that you will be saved."

Allen Ginsberg: But you see it as actually a historical thing of ten thousand years for the chanting?

Srila Prabhupada: Now it will increase.

Allen Ginsberg: Until?

Srila Prabhupada: Up to ten thousand years.

Allen Ginsberg: And then?

Srila Prabhupada: Then diminish.



Allen Ginsberg: So what is the purpose right now?

Srila Prabhupada: People will take advantage of this up to ten thousand years. Then they will...

Allen Ginsberg: So this is like the last rope, the last gasp.

Srila Prabhupada: [Laughs.] Yes. So the sooner we take shelter shelter of Krsna consciousness the better.

Allen Ginsberg: When did this yuga begin?

Srila Prabhupada: Kali-yuga began five thousand years ago.

Allen Ginsberg: Where is all this information?

Srila Prabhupada: In the Vedic literature, the *Bhagavatam*.

Allen Ginsberg: It has the detailed analysis of what goes on in the Kali-yuga?

Srila Prabhupada: Oh, yes. I will read it to you sometime. In the Twelfth Canto, the Kali-yuga descriptions are there. And you will find that all the descriptions are coming true. Just like there is one

statement, *svikara eva udvahe*: "Marriage will be performed simply by agreement." Now that is being done.

And *lavanyam kesa-dharanam*: "People will think that they have become very beautiful by keeping long hair." That is coming true.

Allen Ginsberg: In the *Bhagavata Purana* is

there also provision for the Caitanya cult?

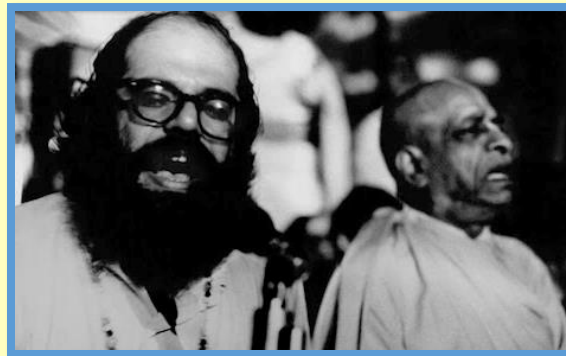
Srila Prabhupada: Oh, yes. We have given that in our book *Teachings of Lord Caitanya*.

Allen Ginsberg: Within this period of ten thousand years, only those who hear Krsna's name and worship Krsna by chanting...

Srila Prabhupada: They become liberated and go back home, back to Godhead.

Allen Ginsberg: And everybody else gets involved deeper and deeper in the yuga.

Srila Prabhupada: Yes, yes. So if anyone believes in the *sastras* [scriptures], he should take to this Krsna consciousness. That is intelligence to take advantage of the authorized scriptures. ॐ



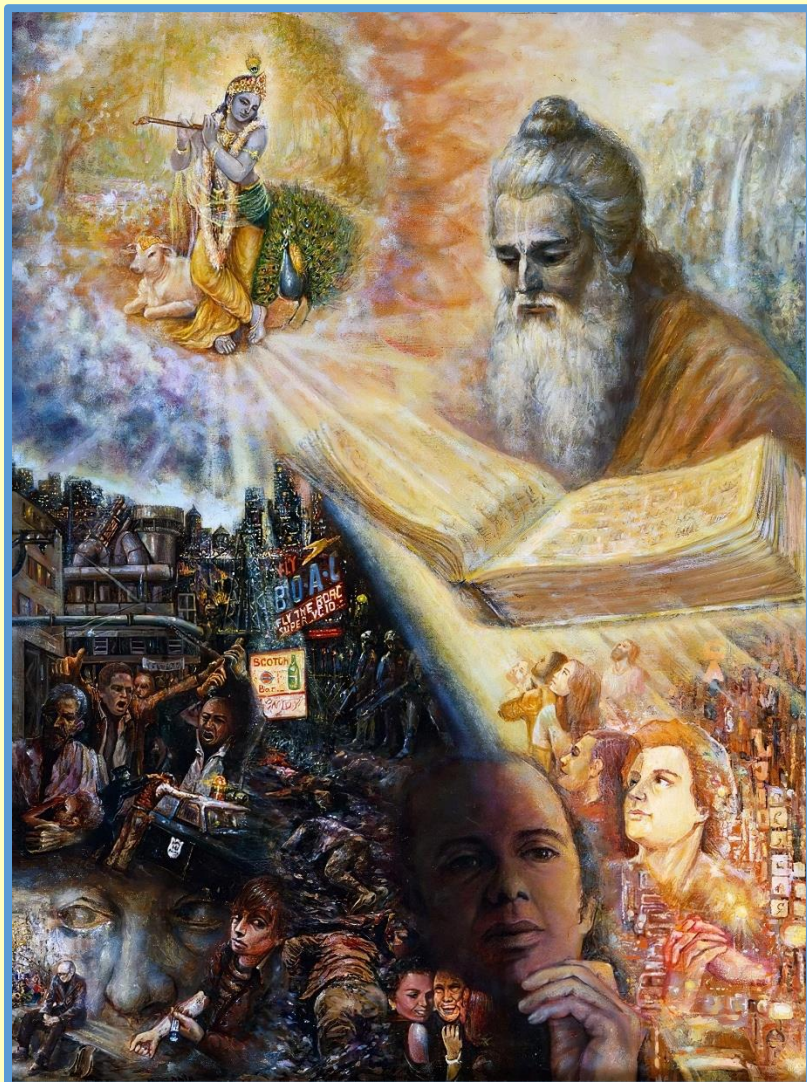

- **Shortened Lifespan & Poor Health:** Lifespans are reduced not just by lack of food, but by irregular habits, artificial standards of living, and over-sense gratification.
- **Laziness & Ignorance:** People are extremely lazy when it comes to self-realization and spiritual awakening, yet highly active in pursuing illusory, material goals.
- **Quarrel and Hypocrisy:** Society becomes plagued by arguments, distrust, and leaders who exploit rather than protect their citizens.
- **Diminished Qualities:** Religion, truthfulness, cleanliness, tolerance, mercy, duration of life, physical strength and memory will all diminish day by day because of the powerful influence of the age of Kali.
- **Sacredness of Marriage Disappears:** Men and women will live together only through verbal agreement and merely because of superficial attraction.
- **Superficial Qualifications:** Womanliness and manliness will be judged according to one's expertise in sex.
- **Hairstyles will be the Measure of Beauty:** men will think by keeping long hair they become more beautiful.
- **Cheap Goal of Life:** Filling the belly will become the goal of life
- **Shallow Motivation:** the principles of religion will be observed only for the sake of reputation. 🌸

Excerpts from inmates' letters

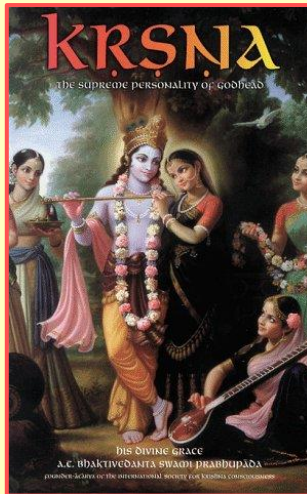
I became interested in Krishna consciousness after reading "Bhagavad-Gita As It Is" which is available on the Edovo app on our tablets. From there I read some of the other books by Prabhupada, and I'm currently reading the Srimad-Bhagavatam, so there is quite a lot to read on the subject on our tablets. I find it so truly fresh and fascinating! I come from a conservative Christian background, and early on I rejected that faith and became an atheist in my angry teen years.

I had chanted the Hare Kṛṣṇa maha mantra before but had no example, so I would repeat it once or twice and be done. But in June of this year, I found the *Japa Example* by Prabhupada on Audio on my Edovo prison tablet and learned how to chant and what a true round is. I have chanted everyday now for about 5 months. I'm up to 3-6 rounds a day now. I finally got beads. My life has improved so much.

I'm not sure who to address this letter to, but whoever it reaches I send you my eternal gratitude. I'm currently incarcerated in San Marcos Texas, and I came across your series of e-books on Edovo, via my Securus tablet. Words cannot describe the amount of joy and bliss I felt once I discovered these beautiful books. I've been incarcerated for 22 months. Prior to my incarceration I was living a life filled with crime and poor choices. However, I have taken advantage of this time away from the distractions of the free world to study the Bhagavad-Gita. I first came across the dialogue of Arjuna and Kṛṣṇa years ago when I was in college. One of my philosophy professors introduced me to the Gita, and I thought it was the most beautiful story I have ever heard. I fell in love with Hinduism and Kṛṣṇa's divine glory! I'm thrilled to find this address. I finally found someone who can help guide me down the path of devotion. I'm seeking some help and guidance in any form. I'm currently waiting to be transferred to the Texas Department of Criminal Justice. I will be incarcerated for at least another 8 years maybe longer. I hope your books will remain on Edovo during my incarceration. I plan on dissecting these books and studying them diligently. I already started digging through chapter 3 of the Gita to learn how to read the



Gita in Sanskrit. I've been reading various English translations, but I want to dive into the Sanskrit and learn as much as possible in the name of our Lord. Once again, I send you a million thank yous, whoever you are. I hope to hear from you one day, I hope you continue the beautiful work. I plan on sharing these treasures I have found with many people, and I plan to send more people your way. You're more than welcome to use this letter for your future newsletters.

I didn't want the pictures just to liven up the cell (dull gray concrete, no paint), but to exchange vibrations with. As you once pointed out, they are actual, have and emanate energy. Energize the environment in here for some good, steady progress. Just from that and japa, I already feel different, better. My japa 'beads' are 108 knots on a loop of string I spun from nylon. It works. ☺ I've begun to economize my time, out of necessity.

Yes, the hole [solitary cell] can be a monastery... Time was also a factor in my ultimate decision to come to Kṛṣṇa. I saw that I was sixty years old already; how long was I going to stall? Each time I tried just one more time to find the right partner or whatever else, I crapped out, snake eyes. Time finally ran out for me. I even stopped wearing a watch. ☺ I'm on Kṛṣṇa time now, which is endless. And it's *always* Kṛṣṇa time. I've begun to say the Panca-Tattva mantra and the Sri Prabhupada pranam each day, first thing, in front of pictures of them you sent.

I discovered Kṛṣṇa books [before going to prison] in 1975 at a swap meet, midway Washington. I saw a "Supreme Personality" book; from 50 feet or so, in big letters, I read *KṚṢṆA*. I says, that word, what that meant? It's not Christ but pronounces similar. I asked the people at the flea market, "How much do you want for that book?" They said "One dollar". I said, "Sure, here you go." I took it home and started looking at the picture plates and reading about the gopis, Balarama, and the cowherd boys. Later on, I was there at the swap meet again and found a different book and it was a dollar, so I had two books then. (...) I didn't have any place to stay so I took my duffel bag and footlocker up in a stairwell at that old hotel. I was up at the top of the stairway with my Kṛṣṇa books open, reading all about Kṛṣṇa. (...) This was in the winter months. Fairbanks

was like 60 below zero. So I was glad to be inside and glad to have Kṛṣṇa to comfort me.”

Build Roads, not Roadblocks

Suppose someone had to go to a place that wasn’t accessible by road. We would expect them to clear a path to get there. If they started making roadblocks instead, we would consider that odd, if not crazy.

Unfortunately, that’s what we do in our mental world when faced with any challenge, say, leading a principle-centered life by resisting temptations. Our mind springs into action, imagining the many problems that may



come up and painting them in their scariest dimensions. Disheartened by the fear of unmanageable problems, we feel like giving up even before we start. Thus, we end up building roadblocks.

What makes us sabotage ourselves like this? Our mind. The *Bhagavad-gita* (06.05) explains that our mind can be both our enemy and our friend – so, we need to carefully use it for raising ourselves, not carelessly let it degrade ourselves. To raise ourselves means, metaphorically speaking, to build roads. We need to envision pathways to rise from where we are to where we aspire to be.

Certainly, we need to consider probable problems and prepare to deal

with them. But such preparation is best done with the thoughtfulness of the intelligence, not the restlessness and fearfulness of the mind. The mind doesn’t just magnify probable problems – it also imagines improbable problems. When the mind dominates us, we can’t foresee and prepare; we simply fret and mope.

Spiritual practices such as scriptural study and meditation alert us to the mind’s shenanigans. By such alertness, we can catch the mind when it starts acting up and stop it from building roadblocks.



Further, spiritual practices sharpen our intelligence. With a perceptive intelligence, we can build roads, that is, make tangible plans for tackling real problems.

By thus subordinating the mind to the intelligence, we can increasingly bring out the best within us, thereby fulfilling our God-given potential. 🌸

Calm the mind by chanting

“If you are lacking enthusiasm, then you should rest, instead of making too much agitation within the mind. Something has dropped in the water, in the river, you cannot see the things dropped within the water by agitating the water. Just stand still for sometimes. As soon as the water is settled up, you’ll see the things as they are. So as soon as our enthusiasm is agitated, it is better to sit down in any temple suitable and chant Hare Kṛṣṇa.”

Bhaktivinoda Thakur (1838–1914) was a pure devotee of the Lord, in the line of disciplic succession in the line of Lord Caitanya. He was a prolific writer and composed hundreds of devotional books, songs and epic verses in Bengali, Sanskrit, and English. In his poems he often writes from the viewpoint of a conditioned soul.

My life is ever given to sin; in it there is not a particle of good. I have caused others great anxiety, and have troubled all souls.

For the sake of my own enjoyment I have never hesitated to perform sinful acts. Devoid of all compassion, I am concerned only with my selfish interests. Perpetually speaking lies, I become dejected upon seeing others happy, whereas the misery of others is a source of great delight for me.

There are limitless material desires within the core of my heart. I am wrathful, fond of exhibiting arrogance, intoxicated by vanity, and bewildered by worldly affairs. I wear the cherished ornaments of envy and egotism.

Ruined by laziness and sleep, I resist all pious deeds, yet am very enthusiastic to perform wicked acts. For the sake of worldly fame and reputation I engage in the practice of deceitfulness. I am victimized by my own greed, being always lustful.

A vile, wicked man such as this, rejected by godly people, is a constant offender. Devoid of all good works, forever inclined toward evil, he is worn out and wasted by various miseries.

Now in old age, deprived of all means of relief, thus humbled and poor, Bhaktivinoda submits his tale of grief at the feet of the Supreme Lord.

O Lord! Please hear the story of my sadness. I drank the deadly poison of worldliness, pretending it was nectar, and now the sun is setting on the horizon of my life.



I spent my childhood in play, my youth in academic pursuit, and in me there arose no sense of discrimination. In young manhood I set up a household and settled down to the spell of material enjoyment while my children and friends quickly multiplied.

Old age soon arrived, and all joys consequently departed. Subjected to the torments of disease, I am troubled and weak. All my senses are feeble now, my body is racked and exhausted, and my spirits are downcast in the absence of former sense pleasures.

Devoid of even a particle of enlightenment, cheated of the mellows of devotion—what help is there for me now? O Lord, You are the friend of the fallen. I am certainly fallen, the lowest of men. Please, therefore, in mercy lift me to Your lotus feet.

Were You to judge me now, You would find no good qualities. Have mercy and judge me not. Cause me to drink the honey of Your lotus feet and thereby deliver this Bhaktivinoda.

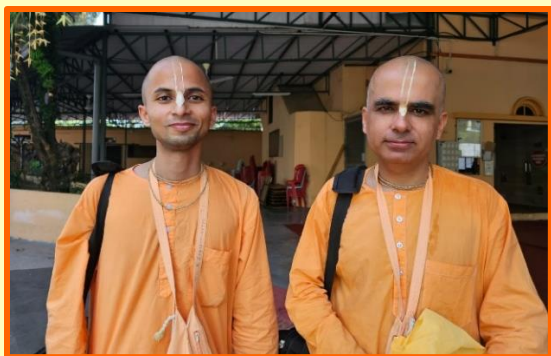
Raghav Kripa Prabhu writes: "Just when the flight landed and it was time to deplane, I was trying to distribute a Bhagavad-gita. Then one fiftyish, white-bodied Muslim man, with a lady in a burka, looked at the Gita. Since he was looking at it intently, I asked him whether he would like to have the book. When he took

it, I asked him for a donation, as it cost about \$5 to print, and to my surprise he gave \$10!

When I asked him his name, he said Majed, which I was unable to pronounce, so he joked that his name was Magic. I smiled and reflected that this moment truly was magic. We'd just arrived in Boston, and this Muslim man so easily took a Bhagavad-gita As It Is, which he gave to his burka mataji to carry. A Muslim lady in a burka carrying Prabhupada's Gita. Such an auspicious sign!

I told Manmohan Shyam Prabhu that Lord Krsna was teaching us a lesson: that Krsna consciousness preaching is pure MAGIC and it is Mahaprabhu's overflowing mercy that spreads Krsna consciousness, which is beyond our reason and logic. We just have to make our sincere best efforts.

After coming out of the airport, I offered my obeisances to Sridham Boston, where Srila Prabhupada had first placed his lotus feet in the USA. 🌸

Next were two brothers waiting for their laundry to finish. One gave me five dollars for a *Perfexion de Yoga*. The other had artistic tatoos, which I complimented. He gave me twenty dollars, and I gave him a *Viaje Facil de Otros Planetas*.

Two more people—a man emptying a dryer and a lady folding clothes—gave me five dollars each for *Viaje Facil de Otros Planetas*. Their easy journey had begun.

While the machine was washing my clothes, I drove to Holy Foods to buy water, milk, butter, and some raspberries for Sri-Sri Radha Kalacandji. In line at the

cash register, I counted out of the book bag change and bills totaling thirty-six dollars and ninety cents. The senora next in line spontaneously gave ten dollars, so I handed her a *Perfexion de Yoga*. Like most people in Texas, she and the cashier spoke Spanish, and she was very happy to receive a Spanish book. I gave her a mantra card, and she clearly recited Hare Krsna Hare Krsna Krsna Krsna Hare Hare Hare Hare Rama Hare Rama Rama Rama Hare Hare.

Reflection: Six people had bought Srila Prabhupada’s books from me when I was not even officially “out on sankirtana.” The books were jumping from the bag like fish from the Ganga. Anyone can sell Srila Prabhupada’s books. Even “off duty.” 🌸

WORLD NEWS — Venezuela Earthquake Relief

Two devotees, Nitilaksa Dasa and Loka Saranga Dasa traveled from the United Kingdom on July 4, organized by Parasuram Dasa and the Food For All UK Headquarters. In addition to bringing financial assistance raised by supporters, the team delivered 30



kilograms of spices to help sustain the large-scale cooking operation serving those displaced by the disaster.

Since the disaster, ISKCON devotees in Venezuela have been serving tirelessly to meet the incredible needs in their country. The FFL-UK volunteers

have joined the ISKCON Food for Life program in Caracas, helping prepare and distribute freshly cooked prasadam (sanctified food offered to Lord Krishna) to families whose homes were damaged or destroyed. Many residents continue to shelter in temporary tents erected in streets and public parks while recovery efforts continue.

The volunteers are currently serving in La Guaira, one of the regions most severely affected by the earthquakes, where devotees have been working



alongside local authorities and emergency responders to provide nourishing meals to both survivors and those assisting with the recovery.

The visit builds upon an emergency response that began immediately after the earthquakes struck northern

Venezuela. Local devotees quickly mobilized kitchens and volunteers, providing warm prasadam to displaced families while working closely with emergency personnel. With support from devotees around the world, the initiative



has continued to expand in both scale and reach.

Together with Food for Life Global, the team of local devotees and Food for All UK is working toward the ambitious goal of distributing 2,000 plates of prasadam each day to earthquake survivors and emergency response teams.

For Nitilaksa Dasa, the past several days have left a

lasting impression. Today he said, “It’s hard to put into words what we’ve seen over the last few days,” he wrote in a recent update. “Entire communities have lost so much, yet the resilience and kindness of the people here is truly inspiring.”

He described serving freshly cooked meals to families living in temporary shelters, as well as to firefighters, rescue workers, police officers, and military personnel who continue working tirelessly throughout the disaster zone. One encounter, he said, especially touched him.

“One moment I’ll never forget was when a firefighter from the Mérida Rescue Team removed the patch



from his own uniform and gave it to me as a gesture of respect for our humanitarian work. I'll treasure it as a reminder that compassion brings people together, no matter where we come from."

As Venezuela continues its recovery, ISKCON's Food for Life volunteers remain committed to serving sanctified vegetarian meals to families affected by the disaster and to the emergency personnel supporting relief operations.

Devotees and well-wishers around the world are encouraged to keep the people of Venezuela in their prayers and to support this important initiative. 🌸
